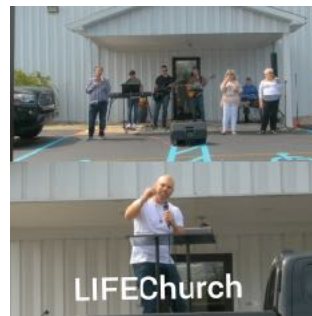

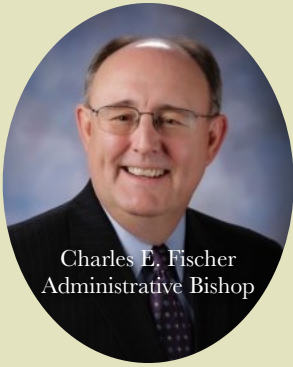

From My Heart

The Joseph Principle

If ever there was a story that begs to be made into a movie, it's the life of Joseph. We find it in Genesis 37-50.

Joseph began his journey as a young man full of dreams. His brothers and his father didn't understand and even felt threatened by his aspirations. Perhaps this was because Joseph in his youthful exuberance came across a little too arrogant. Eventually, his brothers had enough. After contemplating killing him, they eventually sold him into slavery. They smeared goat blood on the colorful robe his father had given him and then took it back to Jacob to convince their dad that Joseph was killed by a wild animal.

Joseph ends up a slave in the Egyptian household of Potiphar, one of Pharaoh's officials. When Mrs. Potiphar falsely accuses Joseph of making inappropriate advances toward her, he ends up in prison. While there, he meets Pharaoh's cupbearer and baker who had fallen out of favor with the king. They each had dreams they didn't understand. God helped Joseph accurately interpret that the baker would end up executed and the cupbearer restored to his job. He asked the cupbearer to remember him, but he forgot him.

A good while later, Pharaoh has a dream that no one can explain to him. Then the cupbearer finally remembers Joseph, the king pulls him out of prison and he correctly interprets that seven years of plentiful

harvest will be followed by seven years of famine. Pharaoh is so impressed, he elevates Joseph to his second in command. What a rags to riches story. But it's not done yet.

Years later, during the years of famine, his father Jacob sends his brothers to Egypt to buy some of the grain Joseph wisely stored up during the plentiful years. The brothers don't recognize Joseph, but he knows exactly who they are. Eventually he revealed himself to them and they brought his father Jacob to Egypt to be reunited with his long lost son. When Jacob died, they feared Joseph would finally take revenge on them. At that climactic moment, Joseph uttered these famous words, "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives" (Gen. 50:20).

This is the "Joseph Principle." It is the Old Testament equivalent of Romans 8:28. The difficult, hurtful and disappointing times that the enemy seeks to use to discourage and defeat us, God wishes to use to develop our character and deepen our faith. As we continue to journey through the crisis of the coronavirus together, let us be thankful that God is using it to stretch us. Online and drive-in services are reaching more people than ever before. Electronic giving is being utilized more widely. Social media is helping us stay connected. The result is the same as with Joseph - "the saving of many lives."

Cancellation Notice

After much thought, prayer, consultation with authorities, the State Council and the State Youth and Discipleship Board, we are cancelling our Refreshing Campmeeting, June 8-12, 2020 and all three of our Youth Camps. This was a difficult decision. We are going this route in the interest of the safety and health of all of our people. We are also mindful of possible financial strains under our present circumstances on local churches, families and the State Office in trying to support these events.

We have tried to wait as late as possible to make this decision, however, the lead time to prepare for these events is swiftly approaching. We are working on some possible “virtual events” that we will do online this summer in the place of Youth Camp. I am planning to try and do “REFRESHING ON THE ROAD” in September. These will probably be one night revival services in several regional locations. Speakers and location information will be sent out this summer. Thanks for your support and understanding.
