



From My Heart Don't Miss Christmas!

In The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion The Witch and The Wardrobe a young girl named Lucy steps through the back of an antique wardrobe and arrives in cold, snowy Narnia. She immediately meets Mr. Tumnuse who tells her "It is always winter here and never Christmas." That's like going to bed on Christmas eve and waking up on December 26, 2019. The original Christmas story introduces us to four people or groups that missed the first Christmas.

The Innkeeper (Luke 2:7). He's a bad guy in the Christmas story. The inn was crowded with other guests that got there ahead of Mary and Joseph. My hunch is, in retrospect, he wished he had given up his bed for Mary. Don't let an overcrowded life squeeze out room for Jesus. He wants to be the center, not the circumference of vour life.

Fellow Travelers and Bethlehemites (Luke 2:1-3). The census made Bethlehem a busy place. Lots of money was being made on the out-oftown guests. Working people were too busy cashing in to pay attention to a baby born to a peasant couple.

Christmas should remind us there are things more important than money.

Herod (Matthew 2:1-3, 16). King Herod missed Christmas because he was afraid of the competition of another King. He had an inflated idea of his own importance, to the point, that he was willing to murder a bunch of boys two years old and younger. Christmas is not a time to be selfabsorbed. It is time to turn our hearts toward others.

Religious Leaders (Matthew 2:4-6) The chief priests and scribes knew the Scriptures (Micah 5:2), yet they refused to recognize the reality of the Messiah's birth. Ironically, their failure to acknowledge Him years later would lead to His death that brought atonement for our sins. Christmas is a time to not only read the Christmas story, but to put it into practice.

It's winter in Kentucky. But we know the whole story now. We are determined to never miss Christmas. Have a merry and bright time with your church and family!






