From My Heart

Reflections on my Ministry Journey

This Spring, I am celebrating 50 years since I received my call to ministry. It happened in a Sunday night service at the Parkway Church of God in Dallas, TX. As a 14-year-old boy, I knelt at the front pew and prayed through most of the service. At the end of the service, I asked Pastor O.C. Gilbert if I could say something. I told my home church family that God had called me to preach.

The journey from that night until now has been filled with twist and turns, joys and sorrows and successes and failures. God has been faithful to me all along the journey. I have learned so much along the way that there's no way to communicate it all in this small space. Here's seven quick, simple things I've learned that have sustained me.

Anchor Points are a Necessity - Along my ministry journey, there have been plenty of times of doubt and discouragement. The temptation to run away and quit was real. But in those moments, God reminded me of what He did in my heart in that Sunday night service in 1972. That memory is an anchor point that I can tug on in difficult times to steady my heart.

Friends are Priceless - There are a number of ministry couples that Alice and I have been friends with for several decades. We can laugh together, cry together, vacation together and be vulnerable together. Money can't buy this treasured blessing.

Never Stop Learning - I disciplined myself to get a B.A. in Christian Ministries, a Master of

Divinity in Parish Ministries and I'm currently working toward a D. Min. degree. I'm a voracious reader. I'm always reading two books at a time. One that is ministry related and one that is historical or biographical in nature. The day you stop learning is the day you start dying.

<u>Stretching is Painful, but Productive</u> - The older I get, the more aches and pains I feel. But I force myself to walk and exercise to stay healthy and hopefully prolong my life. What works physically, is also good for us mentally and emotionally.

<u>Relationships are Bridges</u> - You earn the right to speak into and influence other people by building bridges, not barriers, to their lives. These bridges can help us obtain resources and get opportunities to minister to people that would otherwise never happen.

Failure Doesn't Have to be Fatal - There are plenty of things I've done that didn't work out so well. You have to be mature enough to acknowledge it, learn from it and move on.

Family Life is a Guarded Treasure - 46 years ago I met Alice. A year later, we were married. We raised a daughter and son. We're now blessed with a wonderful son-in-law, daughterin-law and three grandchildren. Family is our first ministry responsibility. If that's not protected, your ministry will be vulnerable. Cherish your spouse and children above everyone else.

Tornado Relief Update

"It was amazing how people worked hand in hand and side by side, and the donations that flooded the area for the tornado victims, was such a blessing. God's people are amazing, and the love of God was shown to our area in abundance!" -Marlene Farmer, Dawson Springs

As of April 12, 2022, donations of \$258,729.40 from 121 individuals, churches and state offices have come into and been distributed by the Kentucky Church God State Office. We are extremely thankful for this generous response from our brothers and sisters in the Lord from across the United States.

You will be hearing more about the tornado relief effort at Refreshing this summer, but we wanted to share a brief update with you now.

Central City, Pastor Brian Davis

Central City Church of God gave out food to 120 families, distributed 220 pairs of new shoes in partnership with Samaritan's feet, furnished Bremen Elementary 430 pairs of new shoes, distributed diapers and baby

products to over 200 families, provided motel rooms to displaced survivors. Pastor Brian Davis provided Chaplain and Pastoral services to those affected as well as joining with other churches in the county to minister to those affected by the tornado. The church opened their fellowship hall for work crews to stay in.



Dawson Springs, Pastor Raymond Farmer

Dawson Springs put one family that lost their home up in a hotel and helped with the purchase of a camper and the supplies that they would need to live until they could rebuild. They provided funds for a college student to help replace her car and laptop. Pastor Farmer has been involved in repair work and building new homes in the Dawson Springs and Princeton areas. They have provided supplies to many people that have been displaced. The Dawson Springs congregation has helped with clean up, salvaging belongings, and cooking and serving meals. They have also helped taxi people from the Amish community who wanted to join in the relief effort.

Bowling Green, Pastor Stephen Oliver

The Bowling Green church was able to help 10 families and provide them with supplies. They helped a Spanish church with donations and supplies as well as providing supplies for 2 nursing homes. They also housed Men and Women of Action in their fellowship hall while they worked on the Spanish church.







Mayfield, Pastor Robert Davis

Mayfield Church of God opened their doors to serve their community two days after the devastating tornado hit their city. With the help of Operation Compassion, Men and Women of Action, God's Pit Crew and over 200 volunteers from 13 states, 3,000 hot meals were served, 80 tons of products and supplies were distributed, 5,000 families were helped, 400 children received toys at Christmas and generators were installed and given out to families as needed.



Madisonville, Covenant Community Church, Pastor Michael Knight


With over 300 volunteers, Covenant Community jumped on board to help with relief efforts. They served as a command center, funneling donations to points of distribution that they set up in the four most affected areas. They immediately began collecting and distributing goods. They cleared out their warehouse over 13 times with over 35 semi trucks bringing in items. They distributed over \$25,000 in gift cards. Covenant Community hosted over 200 volunteers, distributed over \$400,000 in restoration checks and approximately \$200,000 in building supplies, furniture and other necessities. They also collected and distributed over 25,000 Christmas presents!





The stage for a Comeback is set. All we need is you and your students to make KYC a tide-turning experience for our youth!


