

Where Are You Standing?

In 1675, Sir Isaac Newton said "If I have seen further, it is by standing on the shoulders of giants." I am reminded every day, that any success in ministry that I have experienced is because of "the giants shoulders" that I have been standing on. Some have names that are easily remembered, others you have never heard of. My list of giants is too long for this brief article, so I'll just introduce you to a few.

<u>Sister Reeves and Sister Martin</u> - These ladies were two of my boyhood Sunday School teachers. Through flannel graphs, hands on projects and speaking to my age level, they helped me fall in love with the Bible.

<u>Walter Risner</u> - He was our Sunday School Superintendent when I was a very young boy. Every Sunday morning before he turned the service over to our pastor, he would sit down at the baby grand piano to lead us all in singing "Oh, How I Love Jesus!" Through six decades, that song has got me through many tough times.

Kenneth Stephens - He came to be our pastor just as I turned 15 years old. I had been preaching one year. He was a model of pastoral care. He took a personal interest in me and spent time talking with me about ministry and modeling it before me. The seeds of any pastoral gifts I have were planted by this loving shepherd.

<u>James Slayton</u> - This pastor first let me preach for him in Ennis, TX when I was 15. He always carried a tiny pocket size Bible, but he never looked at it. He could quote long passages of Scripture. He taught me the discipline and inspired me to memorize scripture.

<u>Dr. Joseph Laing</u> - Arriving at West Coast Bible College in the Fall of 1976, I was immediately introduced to this incredible, but not flashy, Christian giant. I took more classes from him than any other professor. He instilled in me the skills and values for teaching small groups. This has brought me some of my greatest joys in ministry.

<u>Dr. Robert Crick</u> - I was a 23 year old seminary student in Cleveland, TN. I had just got some devastating news that crushed me on multiple levels. I went straight to his office, told him what happened and laid down on his couch, crying and sobbing. He quietly listened to me and was just there for me. In the 40 years of ministry since then, I've learned that sometimes just being there is what comforts people most.

Bennie Triplett - For four and a half years I was honored to serve as his Youth and Christian Education Director in Southern Ohio. He was always dressed meticulously. His words were chosen carefully. He prepared for meetings and events with great detail. His spirit of excellence inspired me to always seek to give God and His people my very best.

Who are the spiritual giants in your life? Thank them! Celebrate them! Emulate them!




- ★ A group of seven Pastors and seven District Overseers helped us prepare for the Benchmarking process for all Pastors and District Overseers on October 9, 2021.
- ♦ If you don't have an undergraduate degree, consider contacting The Pentecostal Theological Seminary about their Certificate in Ministry program.
- ♦ Churches in Kentucky over the months of August 2020-July 2021 have experienced a 9.2% increase in tithes.
- ◆ Over the last 2 1/2 years, Glasgow, Bethesda has grown from 4-40 in Sunday worship attendance. Before COVID they were 50-55. Commendations to Pastor Frank & Patricia Peninger.
- ◆ September 1, 2020 June 30, 2021 there were 4,883 people saved through our local churches ministries. This was more than any other 4-Star State in the Church of God.










Second Mile Ministries

"House of Cherith has been my saving grace. The moment I walked through the gate, I felt a huge relief. As if a huge monster fell off my back. I was welcomed in and felt loved immediately. I was welcomed with open arms and given clothes, toiletries of my own room, and a shared bathroom. The bed was nice and comfy. I felt like I was at the Ritz Carlton. Then the RSA's were very loving and treated me like I was their long-lost daughter. I was greeted by other women that loved me immediately and offered me hugs. I felt as though I belonged immediately. I have been to two other programs before and this is the first one I didn't want to run from. The other programs fed me and clothed me too, but they didn't have the Holy Spirit surrounded around them. HOC has God in and all around them. They made me feel loved and wanted the moment I came through the doors. I'm the happiest I have been since I've been with my children.

Thanks, HOC, words can't express my gratitude towards ya'll. I love you!"

BENCHMARKING AND UNPACKING

Research shows that many new pastors feel ill equipped to lead their church. Many existing, even seasoned pastors, feel overwhelmed with the current pressures and changes in pastoral ministry. Benchmarking is a process to help determine the skills, knowledge and key responsibilities needed for effective ministry.

The twin goals in this process are to provide <u>new ministers</u> with a job description that helps them prepare mentally, emotionally and spiritually for what's ahead of them. Next, we want to provide new and currently serving ministers with a personal confidential process that ascertains where they are, in terms of the basic requirements for a Pastor and/or District Overseer, and where they need to be (a GAP Report). This will help each of us see the areas we need to develop in. It is all about better equipping us for successful ministry.
